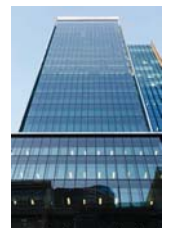


Continuing the theme of collaboration and working relationships, Warwick Quinn and Derek Baxter will give delegates a joint presentation of the industry view of our sector at present.
